COUNCIL BUDGET UPDATE

In March, the council will agree its budget for the forthcoming financial year.

The council sets a budget on a four-year basis. The current four-year plan – the 'Medium Term Financial Strategy' – shows a gap in the budget of over £18 million by 2022/23, due to significant reductions in the money that the council receives from central Government. The council has a legal obligation to set a balanced budget. As such, the council has to find ways to save money or ways to generate new income in order to meet this shortfall.

These reductions are on top of the significant reduction in Government money that the council has already experienced in recent years. Like all local authorities, the council is having to find ways to make savings across all departments in order to deliver a balanced budget.

The council's largest area of controllable spend is adult social care. In common with other councils, the demand for adult social care in Merton has increased in recent years, at the same time as the money available to pay for it has been decreasing. This year, similar pressures are being seen in children's services, which provides care packages for some of the most vulnerable children in the borough.

There is widespread agreement that there is too little funding available for councils to provide adult social care across the country. The Local Government Association which represents councils estimates that there is a shortfall of £3.5 billion between now and 2025. The Government had been expected to publish a Green Paper setting out proposals to reform the system of funding for adult social care last year. At present, it is not known when this will be published.

The council – like all other local authorities – will have to continue to make savings in order to balance its budget until new funding is in place. In making these decisions, the council will continue to do all it again to protect the most vulnerable in the borough, including children and adults in need of social care.

IMPROVING AIR QUALITY AROUND LINKS PRIMARY SCHOOL

A new, experimental safety / air quality scheme is about to be piloted at Links School. Adjacent roads to the school will be closed to **non-residential traffic** during school opening and closing hours, term time only.

Consultation on the effectiveness of the scheme will be carried out with residents before a decision is taken to permanently install it. The scheme is one of a number of measures that the council is taking to improve air quality across the borough.

HOUSES OF MULTIPLE OCCUPATION

Thanks to everyone who reported HMOs to us. We have visited Housing Staff to discuss the high level of HMOs in Graveney Ward. 14 registered and 37 referred for investigation. With almost 50% of the Council's budget cut by Government, adequate staffing level in most services is now a major issue. Staffing in this area is particularly small. However, councilors will continue to press for inspections as soon as possible.

Discussion is also taken place through the Borough Advisory Committee about an Article 4 direction to prevent any further HMOs developing in the area. This process is likely to be lengthy though. Also discussed: HMO Landlords should pay additional fees for waste collection as waste levels are very high in these homes. This is being investigated.
