### LOCAL NEWS

**NEW HEAD TEACHER RECRUITED: Links Primary School has appointed its new Head Teacher, Ciara Parris**. Ciara is currently one of the two Assistant Heads at Links and the school's Senco. She is a highly capable woman that the governors are delighted to have appointed.

**GRANT FUNDING**: Our local community centre - Nemca is pleased to have received confirmation of a further 3 year grant from Merton. Given the difficult state of local government finances, this is very welcome news.

**LIGHTING:** ABC roads off Links and Seely and Streatham & London Road are next in line for replacement lighting. LED lighting is considered to be the most efficient and environmental. A significant amount of Graveney Ward already has LED lighting. The remainder has COSMOS lighting which was installed around 2010. This is not likely to be replaced until local government finances are in a better position.

**CONTROLLED PARKING ZONE CONSULTATION IN THE BEECHOLME SCHOOL POLLING DISTRICT GC.** Petitions from local residents have triggered this informal consultation, which is to gauge whether there is an appetite for a CPZ. It will close on the 21<sup>st</sup> June. The results will be analysed and if there is a wish to proceed a statutory consultation will take place soon after. If you haven't responded yet, please do so as soon as possible. The consultation documents have been delivered to all homes in this area.

**GRAVENEY IN BLOOM:** The cameras will be clicking in June to find the loveliest front gardens. 3 gardens will be awarded a £25 garden voucher and the best gardens will be presented with a certificate at our awards ceremony in September.

**ACTION TO TACKLE ROGUE LANDLORDS:** Graveney councillors have been working with council officers to look at how we can address some of the problems caused by Houses of Multiple Occupation (HMOs) and poor landlords in the ward, some of which contribute to some of the challenges around waste management and street cleanliness. Recently the council agreed to look into developing a Selective Licencing Scheme for landlords in areas where there are high numbers of privately rented homes (Graveney is the sixth highest in Merton) and increased anti-social behaviour or crime and also agreed to the introduction of a civil penalties policy. The scheme is due to come into force in June next year.

**CELEBRATING COMMUNITIES:** The council has recently hosted events and activities to support the LGBT+ community and the Caribbean community. The council hosted three days of events to celebrate the outstanding contribution made by the Caribbean community to the borough and the UK as a whole, between Friday 21 June and Sunday 23 June. The events marked national Windrush Day, on 22 June, which was the day in 1948 when the first 500 migrants arrived from the West Indies on MV Empire Windrush. Meanwhile, the council installed a Rainbow Crossing in Wimbledon Broadway outside the recently opened CMYK bar, to celebrate the borough's inclusivity and support this year's Pride in London events.
