#### SPIKE IN BURGLARIES IN GRAVENEY DURING THE WINTER MONTHS

Local councillors and our police team were concerned about the spike in burglaries during the winter months before Christmas, particularly for those residents who were affected by it.

The police report "We continue to patrol the ward, mainly by bike, every day that we are on shift as part of our role as dedicated ward officers.

However due to the spike of burglaries we had during the winter period, we undertook enhanced preventative measures in response. We undertook both high visibility patrols in full uniform and unmarked plain clothes patrols.

We had planned a joint high visibility operation with the other Mitcham wards to ensure that the entire ward would be aware of our presence, but due to the terrorist attack at London Bridge we were pulled away to do reassurance patrols elsewhere.

Although there was a rise in burglaries during the winter, Graveney is still one of the safest wards in Merton and after the spike things have now returned back to the levels we were seeing before."

The police will be at our Public Meeting to answer any questions you may have on this.

### **GRAVENEY COUNCILLORS' MONTHLY WARD TOUR**

#### MONDAY 27<sup>TH</sup> JANUARY 2020

We are pleased to report that the standard of cleanliness we saw across the whole ward was good. A considerable improvement on recent tours. We reported for action: 3 uncollected Christmas trees 15 small flytips, 5 streets below acceptable standard, 9 lots of new graffiti, 2 potholes and 1 broken post.

Special thanks to Graveney Ward Street Champions for their regular reports and street grading. A Thank-You event has been organised for them on 30<sup>th</sup> January.

#### **NEWS** GC3 CONTROLLED PARKING ZONE

3 petitions from local residents in Edgehill, Caithness and Garden triggered the consultation for a CPZ in the area between the railway and Streatham Road. Overall 57% voted for and 35% against a CPZ.

The consultation is now complete and the Cabinet Member has agreed it should go ahead in the following roads: Ridge, Caithness, Park, Garden, Elmhurst, Beecholme, Hill, Edgehill and Streatham Road (between entrance to Mitcham Industrial Estate and its junction with Ridge Road).

Melrose Avenue will not be included in the scheme as its residents voted overwhelmingly against it.

#### **COUNCIL BUDGET**

Each year the council has a legal duty to agree a balanced budget. Unlike the government, the council is not allowed to run a deficit budget.

Local authorities have been under severe financial pressure since 2010 due to significant cuts to their funding which has required large savings to be made in order to achieve a balanced budget.

The draft budget for the next four years proposes around £7 million of savings over the four year business plan. This would ensure the council's budget was balanced in 2020/21, but would still leave a shortfall of over £4m in 2021/22, rising to over £10m in 2023/24. The budget also assumes Council Tax will increase by 1.99% and the Social Care Precept will be levied at 2%; the Government's own assumptions assume local authorities will do both of these.

The council is facing significant pressure on the Dedicated Schools Grant, the money that government gives our schools to fund Special Educational Needs and Disabilities. The money provided is nowhere near enough to address the demand our schools are facing which has left a large gap in the budget which the council is having to find ways to meet.

The budget will be debated at Full Council on Wednesday 4th March 2020.

#### **CLIMATE CHANGE**

Merton Council has been ranked joint second in London, and among the top authorities across the country by Friends of the Earth for its climate change action

Following the council's declaration of a climate emergency in July 2019, work has been taking place to develop an action plan to meet the targets that were adopted.

Following a call for applications in the summer, A Climate Emergency Working Group was formed, comprising volunteers from across the borough with an interest or professional expertise in carbon reduction and sustainability. This group has now met four times and has started developing recommendations to help the council meet its targets. These will be considered and adopted by the council in the coming months.
