## **Council budget update**

In the current financial year, the Council's budget has been significantly affected by the Covid-19 pandemic. At the time of writing, the net cost of Covid-19 to the Council is just over £9.2m, taking account of the additional money the Council has spent and the income it has lost and offsetting that against money provided by the Government. As a result, the Council is currently forecasting a net shortfall of £4.3m for the current financial year.

Merton Council is due to set its budget at a meeting on 3<sup>rd</sup> March 2021. The budget has been difficult to set due to a number of uncertainties. It is likely that the impact of Covid-19 will stretch into the next financial year and beyond, and whilst a Covid grant has been provided for 2021/22, it is unclear what support will be provided beyond this. Similarly, the Government decided not to undertake the Comprehensive Spending Review that was planned in 2020 was cancelled and instead funding was only announced for the immediate year, which makes planning beyond 2021/22 difficult. This is compounded by the fact that a number of the grants announced at the Spending Review in November 2020 were one-off grants, providing no certainty of the level of funding the Council will receive beyond 2021/22.

The draft budget includes a number of savings proposals, some of which have been caused by the fact that the Council has had to spend more money in its response to Covid-19 than the Government has provided. This is despite the fact that at the start of the pandemic, the Government pledged that local authorities would be fully recompensed for the full cost of supporting their communities.

The Government's own calculations assume all local authorities will raise Council Tax by the maximum level – 1.99% - and levy the Adult Social Care Precept – 3%. The fact that the Government assumes local authorities will levy these charges means that they are penalised if they do not, as their spending power will be reduced. The draft budget therefore assumes a Council Tax rise and the Adult Social Care Precept, in line with the Government's assumptions.

## **MORE TREES?**

There is now a 'request a tree' e-form on Merton's website which we would encourage everyone to use if they would like a tree planted within the borough. It is hoped that this enable us to plan our planting programme more efficiently and plant trees where they requested by our residents. This link provides further information.

## MESSAGE FROM OUR SAFER NEIGHBOURHOOD TEAM

Hi Graveney,

We hope you are all keeping safe in these strange times.

Over the past year we have continued to do our normal routine work as well as all the Covid related work on top, so we've been exceptionally busy.

You can still contact us if you need to on our phone: 020 8721 2724 or our email address: GraveneyVW@met.police.uk. But please do not contact us on these methods if you wish to report crime, you can do so online or via 101 and always in an emergency always call 999.

We have been working with the local authority to prevent Anti Social Behaviour issues on the ward. We have recently had success in reducing the amount of reports regarding Garden Avenue. Ambaal's owner has actually done work to prevent people thinking he is the issue. He out of his own pocket paid for two flood lights to be purchased and installed them on his side wall to illuminate the area after it was suggested by police. We also had pushed the council to have the trees at the end of the road cut back ahead of schedule and this has now been done. We also did numerous patrols with both in-house and external council environmental enforcement officers and issued fines for breaches of the Public Space Protection Order in our ward.

We have been happy to see all the good news stories councillors have been sharing about the brilliant work so many of you have all been doing to help others since the start of this pandemic. It makes us very proud to be your Designated Ward Officers!

But with these positives we must remind everyone to follow the restrictions put in place by government, not only are they the law, they are there to protect us all and because of the recent surge in cases over the past few months, the vast majority are following them which is great, but we must not be complacent. Thankfully at the time of writing we personally have not had to issue any Covid fines on the ward, only given words of advice, which is a plus!

As you will have seen in the news vaccinations are progressing at an impressive rate and hopefully this will allow us to get back to a relative normality at some point this year, as we, like most of you, are finding difficult being under restrictions.
